AAE Full Member Associations must have a Code of Conduct in place that reflects at least the requirements of the AAE's Code of Professional Conduct (*AAE Statutes, Article 5*). A new **AAE Code of Professional Conduct** (CoPC) will come into effect from 1 January 2021.

- Anyone who is involved in a Full Member Association's work on reviewing and (if necessary) updating its Code of Conduct to ensure that it reflects at least the requirements of the AAE's CoPC;
- Individual actuaries who would like to improve their understanding of how to abide by the provisions of the AAE's CoPC or similar provisions in their own association's Code.
